- 2) Buy 15 \times android tablets and 2 \times i-pad


The rest of it will be put towards a new sensory wall in the school.

New Curriculum

The current Primary School Curriculum was introduced in 1999. It is now being updated by the NCCA - National Council for Curriculum and Assessment. The Primary Language Curriculum has just been introduced (you may remember some school closures last year), the Primary Maths Curriculum is next - this is why we have school closure for staff training on the 9th May. The rest of the subjects will follow. The NCCA are now collecting feedback from all members of the school community about this. This is the curriculum are children will be using - it is so important we have a say about it. As an educator and a Parent I am concerned about the proposed reduction in time dedicated to literacy which I consider a foundational skill.
